The West KY Select Bred Heifer Sale was held Saturday, November 23, at the KY-TN Livestock in Guthrie, KY. The heifer sale averaged \$1609 on 211 head, with a range of \$1425 to \$2075. The bull sale averaged \$2218 on 11 head with a range of \$1600-\$3800. Nearly 2/3 (132/211) of the heifers sold between \$1425 and \$1600. Heifers and bulls sold to 42 buyers from Kentucky, Tennessee, and Illinois.
