


CALDWELL COUNTY 4-H NEWSLETTER

2024 Livestock Judging Contest

The 4-H Livestock Judging Team had another great year! The State Livestock Judging Contest was held on June 18 in Lexington. There were 125 Kentucky 4-H'ers from across the state participating. The Senior Team placed 2nd Overall. Individual seniors placing in the top 20 Overall were: Evan Cotton - 3rd place, Daniel Laurent - 6th place, Taylor Wynn - 11th place, and Paycen Rogers - 14th place. Senior members also received numerous individual awards at the contest. The Junior Team placed 3rd Overall with Ellie Francis - 5th place, Karoline White - 12th place and Charlie Conger placing 13th.

The Caldwell County Senior Team placed 3rd Overall in Land Judging and Home Site Evaluation.

Did you know that pumpkins boost your immunity! Pumpkins have Vitamin C, Vitamin E, and Folate. All of these strengthen your immune system. More pumpkin in your diet can help your immune cells work better to fight germs and help in the healing process.



Pumpkin Apple Muffins

1¼ cups all-purpose flour 1¼ cups whole-wheat flour 1¼ teaspoons baking soda ½ teaspoon salt 1½ teaspoons ground cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg 1/4 cups honey 2 large eggs

1½ cups fresh pureed pumpkin ½ cup canola oil 2 cups Granny Smith apples, finely chopped

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. In a large bowl, combine flours, baking soda, salt and spices. In a small bowl, combine honey, eggs, pumpkin and oil; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in apples. Fill greased or paper lined muffin cups, two-thirds full. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until muffins test done. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan. Note: Can substitute two cups granulated sugar for honey, decrease baking soda by ¼ teaspoon and increase oven temperature to 350 degrees F.

Yield: 18 muffins

Nutritional Analysis: 200 calories, 7 g fat, 0.5 g saturated fat, 35 mg cholesterol, 160 mg sodium, 35 g carbohydrate, 2 g fiber, 20 g sugar, 3 g protein
